

## • Purchasing a Vehicle:

- o that the new vehicle be test-driven and have a certified mechanic check it out
- HYI may pay up to 45% or \$3,000 and HYI pays inspection fees; the youth pays for insurance and registration
- o the vehicle must pass emission and safety inspections
- o youth must be at least 17 years old with restrictions, i.e., has a job, school counselor/social worker approves, etc.

## • Car Repairs:

- o that HYI pays up to 45% of the Fair Market Value of the car for all repairs
- o that the youth obtain at least two estimates and submits them in writing to HYI
